

A Letter From The Pastor

I have long said that Advent is my favorite season of the church year. Ever since I was in seminary it's been the season where I feel most "at home." I don't usually think of myself as a glass-half-empty kind of person, but the combination of the Advent themes of waiting and longing fit the way I often perceive our broken world. And it's difficult to read or watch the news today and not sense the world's brokenness. It is clear: we still need a savior.

The deep longing I feel for this savior always makes the shift from Advent ("We need a savior.") to Epiphany ("He's already here!") rather difficult for me. It's one of the reasons I've shifted my Advent refrain to include more hope rather than dire despair.

Amanda Gorman, the American poet, has written a children's book titled "Something, Someday" in which a group of children takes on the task of cleaning up a heap of trash. she writes, "You're told not to hope. But you keep hoping anyway." That hope is, I believe, the true gift of Advent. *Expectant* hope. Gorman continues, "You make a promise to each other. You say, 'There is a problem, but it's our problem together. So we can fix it together. The problem is big. But together, we are bigger."

If you add God into the mix–Emmanuel, the *God-with-us* God–then the "we" of that sentence becomes even bigger.

When God became one of us, I truly believed God revealed the way in which God saves the world–through love and mercy, kindness and justice. Perhaps this Advent will draw us back to the center of our hope and perhaps we can trust that the One who saves us is, in fact, with us.

Sharing Abundance: Our Holy Trinity Pantry is becoming recognized by our neighbors and the "word" is on the street. Little by little, more people are dropping by on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 9 AM - 12 Noon to get help with food and household staples. Beginning in December, the 3rd Sunday of each month has been designated as **PANTRY REPLENISH SUNDAY**. Items can be dropped off in the narthex in the designated box.

The following is a list of our current needs:

- Canned Soup: Chicken & Noodle (or Rice) and Vegetable Soup
- · 1 lb. bags of rice (white or brown)
- · 1 lb. bags of dried beans of any type
- . Canned Meat (no pork)
- . Canned Fruit
- . Ramen Noodles
- . Instant Grits or Oatmeal
- . Peanut Butter (16 oz.)
- . Peanut Butter Crackers
- · Paper Towels, Toilet Paper
- · Liquid Cleaners/Soap (small bottles): Dish soap, laundry soap, hand soap, and other cleaners
- Bottled water

(When purchasing canned food items, look for as many pull tab cans as possible to help our neighbors who may not have a can opener available!)

The list will be updated on an as-needed basis. If you would prefer, you may make a monetary donation. This would enable us to purchase items in bulk. Contact David Kluttz or Linda Davis if you have questions. A great big thank you for your support of this important outreach project!



ADVENT is Here!

"As Christians, we use symbols to express visually the basic beliefs of our faith and reminders of the pilgrimage of our life in Christ. Symbols can have heightened meaning for us when associated with particular seasons of that journey. One such symbol is the Advent wreath."

"The Advent wreath has its roots in the pre-Christian practices of northern Europe. People sought the return of the sun in the dark time of the year (at the winter solstice) by lighting candles and fires. As early as the middle Ages, Christians used fire and light to represent Christ's coming into the world. Using this same symbolism, the Advent wreath developed a few centuries ago in Germany as a sign of the waiting and hopeful expectation of the return in glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. The wreath, a circle, came to represent the eternal victory over death through Jesus Christ. The evergreens were a sign of the faithfulness of God to God's people, even in death, and the lighted candles were a reminder of the light of Christ brought into the world...This symbolism can be just as strong for us today."

"The circular shape, a symbol of eternal life, is most important. Four natural colored candles are always appropriate and symbolize the Light for which we wait. Four blue candles matches the blue used for the season, a color representing hope. Some assemblies may have the older tradition of using purple candles, keeping purple as the color for both Advent and Lent."
